Burial permits must be delivered by the undertaker to the sexton or other persons in charge of the burial ground or cemetery where burial takes place, and preserved by him. When the body is to be shipped to a distant point, requiring the service of a common carrier, the body must be prepared for shipment according to the rules and regulations of August 28, 1915, and must be accompanied by a transit permit containing the certificate of the embalmer, which is to be attached to the box containing the body.
