In cases of death from a dangerous communicable disease, or disinterment of a body already interred, the preparation of the body must be conducted according to the rules and regulations contained in bulletin of Aug. 28, 1915, issued by the Territorial Registrar of Vital Statistics.

Burial permits must be delivered by the undertaker to the sexton or other persons in charge of the burial grounds or cemetery where burial takes place, and preserved by him. When the body is to be shipped to a distant point, requiring the service of a common carrier, the body must be prepared for shipment according to the rules and regulations of Aug. 28, 1915, and must be accompanied by a transit permit containing the certificate of the embalmer, which is to be attached to the box containing the body.
