He is survived by his parents, Frank and Angela Lee of Alakanuk; his brothers, John of Anchorage, Edgar of Alakanuk, and Edward Phillip and Patrick Phillip, both of Alakanuk; his sisters, Winifred Selton, Mary Smith, and Alice Phillip and Mary Andrews, all of Alakanuk; and many nieces and nephews. Alakanuk resident Cecelia Amokan Chikigak, 75, died at Alaska Regional Hospital Oct. 12. A Mass of Christian Burial for Mrs. Chikigak was held Thursday at St. Ignatius Catholic Church in Alakanuk, with the Rev. Thomas officiating. Burial took place in Akulurak Cemetery.

Born Sept. 27, 1918, in Black River, she was a lifelong Alaskan who was raised in Akulurk. She was a

member of Calista Corp. Her family said, "Mrs. Chikigak was a homemaker who was very kind and friendly to everyone. She was an excellent sewer who made animal skin and cloth parkas, mukluks and priests' vestments. And she loved to pick greens in the spring." Mrs. Chikigak taught catechism and interpreted for the priests.

Mrs. Chikigak is survived by her husband of 56 years, Thomas of Alakanuk; five sons John, Louis, Arthur, Boniface and Thomas, all of Akulurak; her daughters Teresa George, Martha Kassocho, both of Akulurak, and Wini Chikigak and Flora Chikigak, both of Anchorage; one sister, Angela Kozevnikoff of St. Marys ; 30 grandchildren; and 10 great-grandchildren; and her son, who was adopted by her sister-in-law, Alice Hanson, Willie Hanson of Akulurak. Lifelong Alaskan Francis Lawrence Damian, 57, died Nov. 22, 1995, of a stroke at the Alaska Native Medical Center. All services were held in Alakanuk. Burial took place in Alakanuk Cemetery.

Mr. Damian was born June 26, 1938, in Akarpak and moved to Akulark as a child until his family moved to Alakanuk, where he lived for most of his life. He served in the Alaska National Guard for 20 years, retiring with the rank of sergeant. He worked for Wein Airlines in the 1970s, also working for Camai Air, Larry's Air and Arctic Transportation Services. He had also been the health aide for the village of Alakanuk for 17 years. Mr Damian was a long time member of St. Ignatius Catholic Church in Alakanuk, continuing his involvement with the church since he became an altar boy in his youth. Being mechanically inclined, he was always tinkering with his cars, and repaired fishing boats while he was in Seattle. He built his own home and was always building sleds or occupied with some other project. According to his family, "Although he only received a grade-school education, he was one of the many who learned more from life than those who have received a university education. Francis was always ready with a smile, often called upon to help others since he was very generous. He made us laugh often with his jokes. He lived for his children. He once said he was not afraid of death for himself, but feared for his children at his passing. He was a hard worker. He was busy working on his last project, a sled, when he had a stroke."

Mr. Damian is survived by his wife of 31 years, Agnes Evan Damian of Alakanuk; daughter, Julianna Damian; sons, Jonathan, Jacob and Francis Jr., all of Alakanuk; nieces and nephews he took in when his younger brother died, Rebecca, Alphonsus Jr., and Bryan; brothers, Clifford of Alakanuk and Mark of Anchorage; sisters, Mary Monson of Wieser, Idaho, Mary Theresa Damian of Alakanuk, his "big sister" Mary France of Anchorage and Sylvia Joseph and her family of Alakanuk; and granddaughter Melissa Ann Damian. He was preceded in death by his parents, Barbara and Damian; brothers Alphonsus and Jacob; and sister Sylvia. He also leaves behind numerous relatives.

Alaska resident George Francis Hanson, 55, died June 4, 1991 at his Sunshine Bay home near Emmonak. A funeral was held in Alakanuk. Burial was in the Alakanuk Cemetery.

Mr. Hanson was born Jan. 4, 1936, in Kwigumuet. He had worked as a commercial fisherman and laborer and had worked for Bering Sea Fish Processing and Shanks Seafood. He also in the Alaska Army National Guard. Mr. Hanson is survived by his brothers, John and Charles, both of Alakanuk, and Ted Johanson of Nome. Sophie Sergie

Birth: 1973, Pitkas Point, Wade Hampton Census Area, Alaska

Death: Apr. 26, 1993, Fairbanks, Fairbanks North Star Borough, Alaska

Murder Victim. A student at the University of Alaska, Fairbanks (UAF), she was found dead on the second floor of Bartlett Hall (a women's residence dorm) at the university, with a single gunshot wound to her head.

Born in Pitkas Point, she was considered as exceptionally bright and hard working, a role model for others in her village. She was a Yupik Native American and had won a full scholarship to UAF, and had completed two years at UAF. She wanted to have a career, and planned to become a marine biologist. In the fall of 1992, she took a year off to be with her ailing mother and to have some surgery on her jaw. She stayed with her friend, Shirley Wasuli at her student residence in Bartlett Hall while visiting Fairbanks, where she was having surgery. She planned to return to UAF that fall semester to resume her studies. Violence against women had been escalating in the Fairbanks area that year, according to the local Fairbanks Daily News-Miner newspaper. This was compounded by UAF cuts in desk attendants at the dormitory front doors in 1989, to save money. Just two months before her death, a student at Bartlett Hall accused two basketball players of raping her while another player watched. Later that same month, a drunken naked man was found in the women's bathroom at Bartlett. Sophie was last seen about midnight April 25, when she left Bartlett Hall to have a cigarette. No one was seen with her. A janitor found her body the next day in a bloody bathtub on the second floor of Bartlett Hall. According to police, she had been raped and then murdered. Police investigation at the time was hampered by a lack of detectives and by the fact that the end of the school year was just ending; within two days of her death, over 60 students moved out of the residence hall after finishing final exams. Richard Simon, 30, an electrical apprentice and musician, died Nov. 14 at Humana Hospital-Alaska as the result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident Nov. 2. A funeral was conducted at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Alakanuk. Burial was in the Alakanuk Cemetery.

Mr. Simon was born June 20, 1960, in Alakanuk. He had attended Mount Edgecumbe High School in Sitka and graduated from Emmonak High School. While in Emmonak, he had worked as a volunteer fireman, a fish tender and a jail guard. He was a member of the Civil Air Patrol and was currently in the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local No. 1547 Apprentice Program. While in this program, he was assigned with Anchorage Telephone Utility as a telephone lineman apprentice. He had his own band, the EMO Band, and was the drummer.

He is survived by his companion, Virginia Moore of Anchorage; his mother, Virginia Kossock of Anchorage; his son, Willie of Anchorage; his brothers, Vincent Kossock, Sampson Kossock, and Tim

Ms. Strongheart was born Feb. 5, 1948, in Alakanuk. She had lived in Portland, Ore., from 1954 until returning to Alaska in 1968. From 1968 to 1993, she lived in Alakanuk, and from 1993 until her death, in Anchorage. For most of her life, she was a homemaker. She attended the Assembly of God church and enjoyed knitting, crocheting, reading, camping and writing. The family said: "She had the determination and boldness to seize opportunities. She had the spirit to keep everyone jovial. She had the sense of perfection that she expected her family and friends to follow."

Ms. Strongheart is survived by her daughter, Samantha Afcan of Wasilla; brothers, Charles, Francis and Elmer Patrick, of Alakanuk; sisters, Lisa Cozzetti, Elizabeth Mulhollan and Lena Patrick, of Anchorage, and Martha Patrick of Alakanuk; and granddaughters, Natalie Strongheart and Jasmine Afcan of Wasilla.

Aniak resident, Leo Joseph Morgan, 61, died Aug. 7, 2010, of congestive heart failure. An Anchorage service will be held at 9 a.m. today at Evergreen Memorial Chapel, 737 E St. The Rev. Thomas Gallagher will officiate. The funeral will be in Aniak at 2 p.m. Friday. Leo will be laid to rest at his father's Native allotment.

Leo was born in a tent at Kalskag on Aug. 16, 1948. He graduated from Copper Valley High School in 1967. A Vietnam veteran, he served in the U.S. Navy (1967-71). He studied at UAA and worked for the state food stamp office in Eagle River in the early 1970s, then 10 years at the Aniak Division of Family and Youth Services. He worked for Kuskokwim Native Association (1982-98) as executive director, then went on to become CEO of the Alaska Native Health Board for two years.

Leo served on the Aniak City Council, Aniak Traditional Council, St. Theresa's Catholic Church Parish Council, Kuskokwim Unit 19 Moose Planning Committee, Interior Rivers State Fair, 15 years on the Kuspuk School Board, and was a founding father of The Kuskokwim Corporation, serving on the board of directors, mostly as chairman, since 1979. He enjoyed all activities associated with living a traditional lifestyle along the Kuskokwim River.

Leo was preceded in death by his parents, Carl and Nancy Morgan; grandparents, Michael and Agnes Passamika and George and Mary Josephine Morgan.

### Bethel Cemetery

According to the Pribilof Report of 1949. "Native Alaskan cemetery, where the Kuskokwim River was undermining the caskets and plunging the corpses into the stream just above the city water supply intake."

Bethel, Alaska - In the middle of a dirt field in this western Alaska hub lies a grave, a wooden cross at its head, a small American flag at the foot. This is the inaugural plot of the new Veterans Memorial Cemetery, which will serve the Kuskokwim River town of Bethel and 56 largely Yup'ik Eskimo villages. Members of the local American Legion post spearheaded construction of the two-acre site in a community effort being hailed by national Legion officials as the only one of its kind.



George H. Hohman Jr.

Bethel resident George Hohman Jr., 74, died Nov. 20, 2006, at Providence Alaska Medical Center of prostate cancer. Memorial services were held Dec. 7 in Bethel with the Rev. Chuck Peterson officiating and in Anchorage Dec. 10 with Deacon Dennis Foreman officiating. Some ashes were buried in Bethel; the remaining ashes will be scattered at a later date over Three Step Mountain near Bethel, as he requested.

George was born June 2, 1932, in St. Louis, to George Sr. and Margaret (Church) Hohman. The family moved to Glennie, Mich., and George graduated from high school in Oscoda, Mich., in 1950. He joined the U.S. Army in 1952 and was stationed in Monterey, Calif., where he studied the Russian language. While there, he played baseball for the Army and was a member of the Russian Choir, where he sang tenor and was a soloist. In 1954, the Army sent George to Fort Richardson, where he was a Russian translator, and then to the Pribolof Islands to study the influence of the Russian language on the Native language of the area. When his tour of duty ended, he and his then-wife, Nancy, and two daughters, returned to Michigan to complete his college education at Michigan State University. In 1962, he returned to Alaska with his family to teach for the Bureau of Indian Affairs in the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta. He taught in the villages of Emmonak and Nunapitchuk and was principal-teacher in Kwigillingok for two years. In 1967, he moved his family to Bethel, so his five children could attend secondary school. He taught school and was elected to represent the Yukon-Kuskokwim area as their representative to the State House. In 1972, he successfully ran for the State Senate. George represented the Yukon-Kuskokwim and Bristol Bay districts in the Alaska State Legislature for 16 years, serving both in the House and Senate. In 1986, George married Agnes Thomas of Tuntutuliak. Together they had George's sixth child, Benjamin. Besides living in Bethel, the family spent a year in Russia, where George taught English and furthered his study of the Russian language. George was a teacher, legislator, air-taxi owner, businessman and guide. In retirement, he divided his time between Las Vegas, Nev., and Bethel and pursued his interest in genealogy. In his later years, he especially enjoyed visiting with his many friends all around Bethel and at the senior center. "He was locally famous for his rendition of one of his favorite songs[DASH]the poignant 'Danny Boy,' " his family wrote. His family also wrote: "Some people called George Hohman the 'Tundra Fox'; some called him the 'Singing Senator'; he was 'Sonny' to his parents, brother and sisters. To us, he was Dad, Pops, and Grandpa. We saw him serve the people of his legislative district tenaciously and honorably, and we take great pride that he was a tireless advocate for the residents of all rural Alaska. Many would agree that he was one of a kind, a person who truly made a difference in the world. We have found great solace in the support of his many friends around Alaska."

He is survived by his wife, Agnes Thomas-Hohman; daughters and sons-in-law, Carrie and Paul Longpre and Laura Hohman-Tichenor and Joe Tichenor; daughters, Catherine Hohman and Sally Porto; sons, George III and Benjamin; grandchildren, Jacques Longpre, Zach and Matt Wiseman, Cassandre Hohman and Nancy Porto; sister-in-law, Sophia Thomas and her children, Pavilynn, Peter and Tony, who were part of his Las Vegas family; sisters and brother, Patricia Hook, Bettyanne Hoiem, and Ronald Hohman; and former wife, Nancy Thompson. George was very proud of his Native extended family members who are too numerous to name. He was preceded in death by his grandson, Benjamin; and nephew, Michael. Lifelong Alaska pioneer Tommy L. Moses, 88, died of natural causes Sept. 28, 2010, at Alaska Native Medical Center with family by his side. A Mass will be from 10 to 11 a.m. Wednesday at Evergreen Memorial Chapel, 737 E St. Visitation will be 11 a.m.-noon.

Tommy was born in Aonihtuli to Alexis Sirlok and Kelluinok on March 7, 1922.

Tommy served in the U.S. Army. He joined the Alaska Territorial Guard in 1942-43 and was honorably discharged on March 31, 1947.

Tommy was a subsistence and commercial fisherman, reindeer herder, boat captain of Sifton, store manager and city council member, served on the board of directors of the Emmonak Corporation and served as a parish council for the church. He worked at St. Mary's Mission.

The greatest thing that Tommy did was touch everyone's hearts everywhere during Eskimo Native dances. He was a fiddle player for his friends. He sang songs and loved to dance. He made everyone get up and move around. He would say, "Hep, hep!"

Tommy is survived by his sons and daughters, Simon, Lucy, John, Irene, Maria and Bernadette; his in-laws; and numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren throughout Alaska.

Man, Woman found dead; baby unharmed. Anchorage. A man and woman were found dead with their unharmed baby in a remote western Alaska village when worried relatives went to check on them, family members said Monday.

State troopers were investigating the deaths of Jonathan Paul, 29, and Gina Martin, 26. The couple's one year old daughter, Deann, is staying with Martin's family.

Troopers have not said how the couple died at their home in Kipnuk, a Yupik Eskimo community of 640 people. Even relatives said they haven't been told. Apparent cause of death was by gunshot.

"Nobody knows what happened" said Gina Martin's sister, Jessica Martin. "Just pray for us." Jessica Martin said she and her mother found the bodies when they went to the couple's home late Saturday night after not hearing from Gina Martin all day.

The door was locked, so Jessica Martin broke in with a butter knife, she said. She couldn't tell what caused the deaths. "I just took the baby and left," she said.

Her mother, Dolly Martin, called a tribal police officer, who notified troopers. Kipnuk is located near the coast of the Bering Sea, about 475 miles west of Anchorage. Many in the community rely on a subsistence lifestyle, and trapping brings income as well. Most jobs, such as commercial fishing and construction, are seasonal, according to a state community database.
