hat is the primary objective of the Uniof Alaska? I would state it this way: To he minds of our young men and women to arning and to use the knowledge gained for betterment.


he love of learning and the desire to use your edge for human betterment will make both nind and your life rich and purposeful.

Miss Donoghue headed the Department of Music until January of this year when she married. The 1956 DENALI was dedicated to Miss Donoghue.




Col. K. C. Haycraft

Col. Haycraft is Professor of Military Science and Tactics.






