



Father Jette's carefully compiled census clearly shows another woman named K'its'inokko or "Old Annie" as Arthur Wrights' mother. Elsie John confirms this and says her mother's, mother Julia was K'its'inokkos' sister. K'its'inokko also had a daughter named Bessie Charlie who is the mother of Dorothy Titus and many of the Charlies' in Minto. The confusion about Annie Glass (Korovitino) probably results from her being the mother of different mothers. Celia Wright (Noto) who was known as Arthur Wright's sister.
