KHILTATS. A mining settlement on the Tanana River and the monthly mail route from Valdez to Eagle, 180 m sw of the latter place, its nearest p o.

KIAH SLOUGH. A settlement 50 m nw of Dishkaket.

KIAM. A disc p o on McKenzie Inlet, 31 m w of Ketchikan, the nearest banking point. Copper mining is the only industry.

KIANA. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 100. A p o and mining settlement on the Squirrel and Kobuk Rivers, 320 m by water ne of Nome, the nearest banking point, 60 ne of Kotzebue, the supply point.

KILLISNOO (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 275. A p o and Indian village on Admiralty Island and Chatham Strait, 60 m ne of Sitka and 100 s of Juneau, its banking point. Has a Russian church and government school for natives. Boats to Sitka, fare \$6, and Juneau \$10.

KING. A station on The Alaska Railroad, 21 m n of Matanuska, the nearest p o and 61 n of Anchorage, its nearest banking point.

KING COVE. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) A disc p o on Alaska Peninsula, 200 m ne of Dutch Harbor, 500 sw of Seward, nearest banking point, and 100 n of Sanak, mail point.

KINIAAK. A settlement on Bristol Bay, 75 m e of Nushagak, nearest p o.

KINNEY'S ROADHOUSE. A roadhouse at the mouth of Hot Springs Slough, near Kemperville. Hot Springs is its nearest p o.

KIPNIAK. A native settlement on Norton Sound, near the mouth of the Yukon River, 120 m sw of St Michael, the nearest p o.

KISKA ISLAND. One of the Rat Islands of the western Aleutian group.

KIVALINA. Pop 87. An Eskimo village at the mouth of a river of the same name, on the Arctic Ocean in northwestern Alaska, 150 m nw of Kotzebue, its nearest p o. Has reindeer herds and government school for natives.

KLAHANGAMUT. A native settlement on Kuskokwim Bay, 135 m w of Nushagak, the nearest p o.

KLAMASQUATTIN. A native village on the Yukon River, 90 m n of Anvik, and 60 sw of Nulato, the nearest p o.

KLAWOCK. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 300. A p o, town and steamboat landing on Prince of Wales Island, 135 m sw of Wrangell and the same distance w of Ketchikan, the nearest banking point. Sustains a cannery, 3 general stores, U S Public School for Natives, and a Presbyterian Church. Fishing is the principal industry. Mail weekly by boat from Wrangell.

KLIHMUT. A native village on the Kuskowim River, 50 m s of Holy Cross, the nearest p o.

KLINGQUAN. Formerly an Indian fishing settlement on Prince of Wales Island, 58 m sw of Ketchikan, the nearest banking point, 25 e of Howkan. Hydaburg is the nearest p o.

KLUKWAN. Pop 300 (natives). A disc p o on the Chilkat River, 100 m nw of Juneau, the nearest banking point, and 23 nw of Haines, its nearest p o. A government school for natives is located here.

KNIGHTS ISLAND. See Hubbard.

KNIK. Pop 150. A disc p o, steamship landing and trading post situated on Knik Arm, the west branch of Cook Inlet. It is 18 m ne of Anchorage, the nearest banking point. Mail to Anchorage.

KOCHKOMUT. A native settlement on the Yukon River, 45 m sw of Holy Cross, the nearest p o.

KODIAK. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 400. A p o and steamboat landing first settled in 1795, on Kodiak Island in the Gulf of Alaska, between 700 and 800 m w of Juneau and 160 sw of Seward, the nearest banking point. Sustains a public school, a Baptist orphanage and church, a Russian Orthodox church, three general stores, hotel and salmon cannery. A government live stock experimental station is located here. U S Naval Radio Station on Wood Island 2 m e. Mail monthly from Seattle and intermediate points via Cook Inlet.

KOGGIUNG. A cannery settlement on Bristol Bay, at the mouth of the Kvichak River. A government school for natives is located here. Gold is found in the vicinity. Seward is the nearest banking point. Nushagak 60 m w, is the nearest shipping point and p o.

KOKRINES. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 80. A p o, telg and trading station on the Yukon River, 390 m w of Fairbanks and 190 ne of Iditarod, banking point.

KOLMAKOFF. A native settlement on the Kuskokwim River, 100 m (air line) s of Iditarod, the nearest banking point, 80 ne of Bethel, its shipping point and usual p o, and 60 se of Holy Cross, its nearest p o.

KOLMAKOFFSKY. A native settlement on the Kuskokwim River opposite the mouth of the Yukwonilnuk River, 80 m s of Iditarod, the nearest banking point and p o.

KOLTAG. See Kaltag.

KONGROCK CREEK. A mining settlement on a creek of the same name near Nome, the commercial point and p o.

KOOT. A native settlement on Nunivak Island, in Bering Sea, 300 m sw of St Michael, the nearest commercial point and p o.

KOOTLIK. See Kutlik.

KOOTZENHOOD. See Killisnoo.

KOSEREFISKY. A disc p o, settled in 1889, on the Yukon River, 345 m se of Nome, 200 se of St Michael, 100 sw of Iditarod the nearest banking point, and 5 ne of Holy Cross, its p o.

KOSTAKA. A native village on Cook Inlet 30 m sw of Tyonok, 40 w of Kenai, the nearest p o. Coal and oil deposits are found.

KOTSINA. A disc p o and flag station on the Copper River & Northwestern Ry, for a scattered mining district near the head of the Kotsina River, 148 m ne of Cordova, its nearest banking point, and 30 ne of Chitina the nearest p o. Several promising copper properties are located in this valley.

KOTZEBUE. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 230 (natives and whites). A p o, native village and trading station situated at the ne entrance of Kotzebue Sound from the Arctic Ocean, 200 m (400 by water) ne of Nome, the nearest banking point. This is the distributing point for the Kobuk, Noatak and Selawak Rivers. Mining, fishing and furs are principal industries. Three general stores, government school for natives and the Friends Mission are located here.

KOUGAROK. A mining camp at the headwaters of the Kougarok River, near Davidson, 100 m ne of Nome the nearest banking point, 50 ne of Teller, its nearest supply point. A number of large and small streams in this district show rich gold deposits. Taylor is the nearest p o.

KOUGAROK RIVER. A mining settlement on a river of the same name which flows into the Kuzitrin River, 70 m n of Nome.

KOYUK RIVER. A mining settlement on Norton Bay at the mouth of Koyuk River, 170 m e of Nome, the nearest banking point and 80 e of Council. Golovin is its nearest p o.

KOYUKUK. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 125. A p o and U S telegraph and signal station, settled in 1898, on the Yukon River near the mouth of the Koyukuk River, 270 m ne of Anvik, 530 w of Dawson, Y T, and 120 e of Nome, the nearest banking point. Contains two general stores, a government school for natives and a Catholic church. Deposits of gold are found in the vicinity.

KRUZEMAPA HOT SPRINGS. A mineral spring and resort on the Pilgrim River, a tributary of the Kuzitrin River, about 100 m n of Nome. The hot spring keeps the ground thawed for half a mile around, and almost every variety of vegetables are grown here.

KUNEY. A flag station on The Alaska Railroad, 12 m n of Anchorage, the nearest banking point and p o.

KUSLUK. See Fish River.

KUSSILOF. A settlement at the mouth of a river of the same name on Cook Inlet, 12 m s of Kenai, the nearest p o. Fishing and salmon canning are the only industries.

KUSTATAN. A native settlement on Cook Inlet, 38 m sw of Tyonok, and 30 nw of Kenai, the nearest p o. Oil and coal are found in the vicinity. At many points in the sandrock hills the oil oozes out and stands in pools or floats away to the ocean.

KUTLIK. A trading post and steamboat landing on Norton Sound, 6 m s of the mouth of the Yukon River, 65 m sw of St Michael, the nearest p o.

KUYIKANUIKPUL. A native village on the Yukon River, 15 m sw of Holy Cross, the nearest p o.

KUZITRIN RIVER. A mining river flowing into Salt Lake, 90 m n of Nome and 20 e of Teller, nearest supply point and p o.

KVICHAK. A native settlement on Bristol Bay at the mouth of Kvichak River, 60 m e Nushagak, the nearest p o.

KWEEGAMUT. A native village on Nunivak Island on the Bering Sea, 290 m sw of St Michael, the nearest p o.

KWIGUK. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) A recently established p o on Norton Sound, sw of St Michael.

KYAK. See Kayak.

LADD'S STATION. A trading post on Cook Inlet 5 m ne of Tyonok and 40 w of Anchorage, the nearest p o.

LAKE BAY. A disc p o and fishing settlement on the west shore of Prince of Wales Island, 40 m sw of Wrangell, the nearest banking and mail point.

LAKE CITY. On the Tolovana trail 53 m w of Olnes.

LAKE ROADHOUSE. On the Fairbanks-Chitina trail, 56 m s of Fairbanks, nearest banking point, and 12 n of Richardson, nearest p o.

LANDLOCK. A disc p o and mining settlement on Landlock Bay, Prince William Sound, 12½ m se of Ellamar, nearest p o, 40 sw of Valdez, nearest banking point.

LANE'S LANDING. Name changed to Shelton.

LATOUCHE. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 505. A p o on an island of the same name in Prince William Sound, 80 m sw of Valdez and Cordova and 70 ne of Seward, the nearest banking point. There is a general store, hospital and school. Here is located the famous Beatson Copper Mine (Kennecott Copper Corporation), which produced over two million pounds of copper in one year. Mining is the principal industry. Mail five times a month.

LEATHER VILLAGE. A settlement on the Innoko River, 10 m n of Holy Cross, the nearest p o.

LIEBIGSTAG. A settlement on a river of the same name, 70 m n of Valdez, the nearest p o. This place is located in the Copper River Mining District and has gold and copper deposits in the vicinity.

LIGNITE. A station on The Alaska Railroad, 110 m sw of Fairbanks, the nearest banking point, and 50 s of Nenana, its nearest p o.

LINCOLN ROCK LIGHT STATION. On Lincoln Rock 20 m from Wrangell.

LINDBLOOM CREEK. A mining settlement on a creek of the same name, flowing into the Snake River, 20 m ne of Nome, which is the nearest banking, shipping point and p o.

LITTLE CHENA ROADHOUSE. A roadhouse on Little Chena River, 14 m e of Fairbanks, the nearest banking point and p o.

LITTLE CREEK. A mining camp and station on the Seward Peninsula Ry, 3½ m n of Nome, its p o.

LITTLE DELTA. A telegraph station at the confluence of the Little Delta and Tanana Rivers, 60 m se of Fairbanks, nearest banking point.

LITTLE ELDORADO. A station on the Tanana Valley Railroad, 24 m n of Fairbanks, 6 s of Chatanika, nearest p o.

LIVENGOOD. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 131. A p o and mining camp on a creek of the same name, a tributary of the Tanana River. Fairbanks is the nearest banking point.

LIVENGOOD CREEK. One of the principal creeks in the Tolovana mining district. Livengood is the p o.

LOCKONOK. A cannery settlement on Bristol Bay, 450 m by dog team in winter (1300 by boat in summer) sw of Seward, the nearest banking point. Nushagak is its nearest shipping point and p o.

LONG. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 600. A p o and mining town, settled in 1910, on the Yukon River, 30 m from Ruby, the nearest landing for shipping, 150 n of Iditarod nearest banking point. Local telephone connections. Washington-Alaska Military Cable & Telegraph System. Daily stage to Ruby. Mail weekly

LONG ISLAND. See Howkan.

LOOKOUT CREEK. A mining settlement on a creek of the same name, near Nome, the banking, shipping point and p o.

LORDS HARBOR. A fishing station on Shelikof Strait, near Karluk, its nearest shipping point. Uyak is the nearest p o.

LORING. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 175. A p o on Revillagigedo Island and Naha Bay, settled in 1886. It is 22 m n of Ketchikan, its nearest banking and shipping point.

LOST RIVER. A mining camp on a river of the same name, about 30 m nw of Teller, its nearest p o.

LOUDON. A signal station and trading post on the Yukon River, half way between Koyukuk and Melozi.

LOWER TONSINA. Located on the Chitina-Fairbanks trail, 15 m n of Chitina.

McCALLUM. See Yost's.

McCARTHY. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 127. A p o and village, first settled in 1912, on the Copper River & Northwestern Ry, 191 m ne of Cordova, the banking point. It is the shipping point for and has stage connections with the Chisina, Dan Creek and Nizina mining districts. A weekly newspaper is published.

McCARTYS. A roadhouse on the Chitina-Fairbanks summer trail, 231 m n of Chitina and 90 m s of Fairbanks.

McDANIEL'S ROADHOUSE. Now called Woodlawn Roadhouse.

McGRATH. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 90. A p o and trading post on the Kuskokwim River, 600 m se of St Michael, 100 (air line) s of Iditarod, the nearest banking point.

McKINLEY. A p o and placer mining camp in the Fairbanks Mining District of Central Alaska.

McKINLEY PARK. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) A p o on The Alaska Railroad near the Nenana Coal fields, 115 m s of Fairbanks, banking point.

MASTODON. A mining settlement on a creek of the same name, first settled in 1894, 350 m nw of Dawson, Y T, the banking point, and 60 sw of Circle. Deadwood and Miller House are the nearest postoffices.

MATANUSKA. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 25. A p o on river of the same name, first settled in 1915, on The Alaska Railroad at Matanuska Junction, 37 m ne of Anchorage, the nearest banking point, and 146 n of Seward, also a banking point. MEDFRA. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) A recently established p o on the Kuskokwim River, near McGrath.

MEIER'S ROADHOUSE. A roadhouse on the Fairbanks-Chitina trail, 186 m s of Fairbanks and 121 n of Chitina.

MELSING CREEK. A mining creek which enters the Niukluk River at Council. It is a good mining district and runs parallel with Ophir Creek, 1 m e. Council is the nearest p o.

MESHIK. A native settlement on Bristol Bay, 100 m ne of Sand Point, the nearest p o.

METLAKATLA. Pop 600. A p o and native village on Annette Island, first settled in 1887, 260 m se of Juneau, the capital, and 15 s of Ketchikan, the nearest banking point. Has school, Christian church, fruit canning plant, two salmon canneries, saw mill and several general stores.

MICHAELOVSKY. See St Michael.

MIDNIGHT. A disc p o on Knight Island, 100 m sw of Valdez, 25 n of Latouche, the nearest p o.

MIKE HESS. A mining settlement on a creek of the same name in the Tolovana mining district. Livengood is the nearest p o.

MILLER HOUSE. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop, summer 200, winter 100. MOIRA SOUND. A fishing settlement on a sound of the same name, 90 m sw of Juneau. Ketchikan is the nearest banking point and p o.

MONTAUK. A steamboat landing on the Yukon River, 42 m nw of Eagle, the nearest p o.

MONTEVIDEO. A settlement 225 m se of Nome, the nearest banking point, and near Anvik, its p o.

MONUMENT POINT. A settlement on the Tanana River, 25 m below Chena.

MOONLIGHT SPRINGS. A mining settlement 4 m n of Nome, its p o, for which city the springs furnish an abundant supply of water.

MOORE CITY. A mining settlement on Gaines Creek, a tributary of the Innoko River, 60 m nw of Iditarod, the banking point, and 10 sw of Ophir, the nearest p o.

MOORE CREEK ROADHOUSE. Located on Moore Creek, 49 m e of Iditarod, the nearest banking point, and 20 sw of Ophir, its nearest p o, on the main trail to Seward.

MOOSE CREEK. A disc p o and station on The Alaska Railroad, 50 m n of Anchorage, its banking point, and 5 n of Palmer, the nearest p o.

MOUNTAIN VILLAGE. A native settlement on Yukon River in Western Alaska. A government school for natives is here.

MUMTRAHAMUT. A native settlement on Goodwin's Bay, 125 m w of Nushagak, nearest p o.

MUNSON'S ROADHOUSE. See Salchaket.

MURDER COVE. A whaling station at the south end of Admiralty Island, 90 m s of Juneau, the nearest banking and shipping point, and 15 s of Killisnoo. Tyee is the p o name.

NAKNEK. A disc p o and cannery station on Bristol Bay at the mouth of the Naknek River, 450 m by dog team in winter (1300 by boat in summer) sw of Seward, nearest banking point. Naknek is the shipping point for Koggiung, Lockonok, Ugaguk and Ugashik. Nushagak, 50 m w, is the p o.

NANDELLS. A settlement 145 m sw of Eagle, the nearest p o. The inhabitants are mostly natives.

NATAMUTE. A roadhouse and trading post on the trail near Iditarod, its banking point and p o.

NATCHEK. A settlement, also called Port Etches, on Hinchinbrook Island in Prince William Sound, 40 m sw of Orca and 27 sw of Cordova, the nearest banking point and p o. Has steamboat connection with all Alaskan points.

NATION. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 25. A mining village and p o, first settled in 1898, on the Yukon River, at the mouth of Fourth of July Creek, 150 m nw of Dawson, the nearest banking point, and 52 nw of Eagle. Communication with the whole Yukon system weekly.

NEAR ISLANDS. Comprising Agattu, Attu and Semich Islands, forming the most westerly of the Aleutian group in Southwestern Alaska.

NELSON. A disc p o in Southeastern Alaska, 15 m nw of Cordova, nearest p o and banking point.

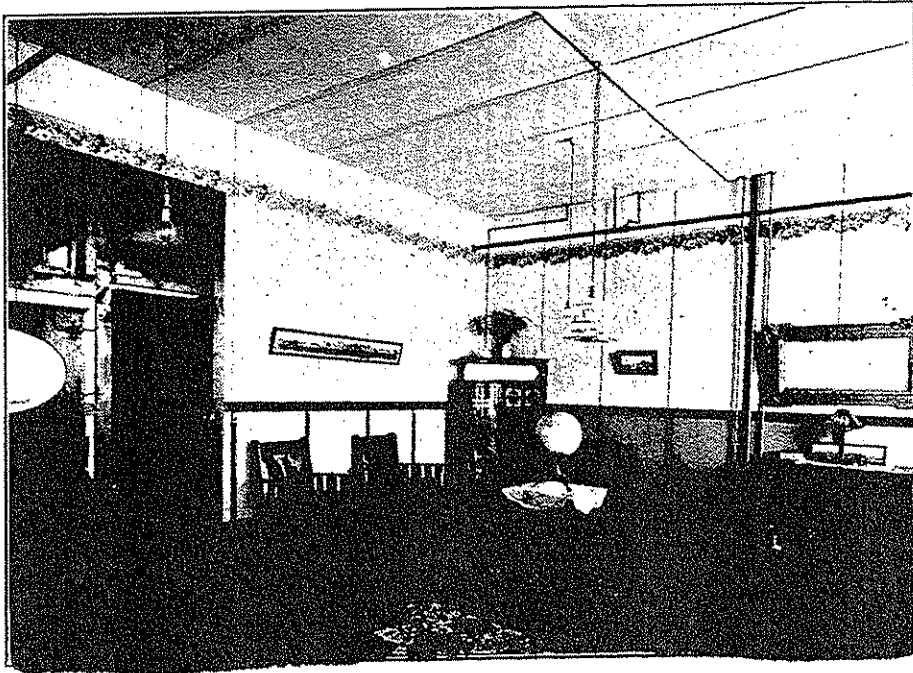

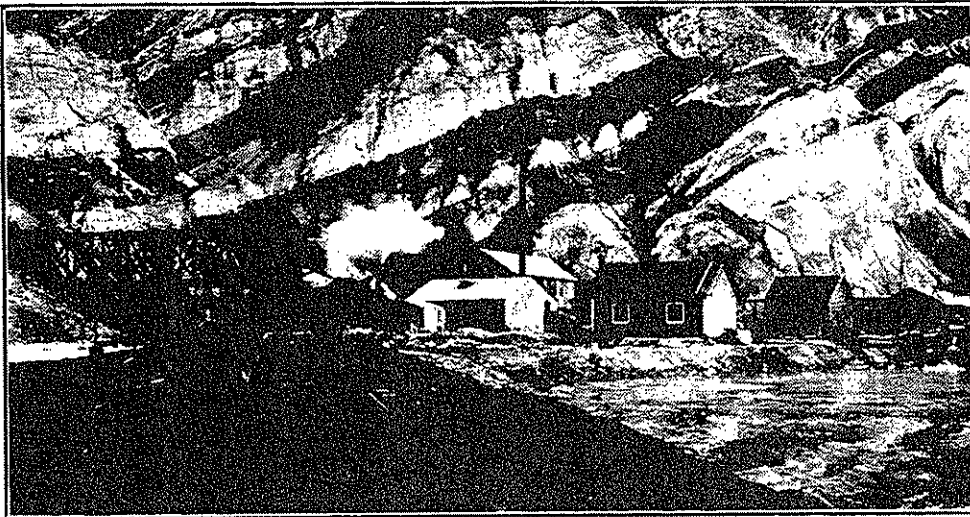

NEW FORT HAMILTON. A steamboat landing and trading post on the Yukon River, 135 m se of Nome, the nearest banking point, and 95 sw of St Michael, its nearest p o.

NEWHALDATILDEN. A U S telegraph station on the Yukon River, 40 m n of Kaltag.

NIBLACK. A mining settlement, also known as Niblack Anchorage, 35 m w of Ketchikan, the nearest banking point. Large lodes of gold and copper ore are found in the vicinity. Steamer communication with Ketchikan every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Dolomi is the nearest p o.

NICKALA GULCH. A mining settlement on Nickala Creek, near Nome, the banking, shipping point and p o.

NIKHAKA. A native settlement on the northern shore of Lake Clark, 40 m n of Iliamna, the nearest p o.

NIKOLSKI. A native settlement on Umnak Island, 100 m sw of Unalaska, the nearest p o.

NINE MILE ROADHOUSE. Located on the Fairbanks-Chitina trail, 9 m s of Fairbanks.

NINILCHIK. A farming and fishing settlement on Cook Inlet, 32 m s of Kenai and n of Seldovia, the p o, in care of which all mail should be addressed.

NIZINA. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) Pop 100. A p o established in 1902, on Chititu Creek, 215 m ne of Cordova, the nearest banking point, 20 e of Kennecott, and 16 s of McCarthy, the shipping point. Placer mining is the principal industry. Mail weekly.

NOHOOLCHINTA. A native fishing settlement on the Melozikakat River, 170 m n of Tanana. Bettles is the nearest p o.

NOHTALOHTON. A native village on the Yukon River, 225 miles ne of Anvik, 170 w of Tanana and 40 e of Nulato, the nearest p o.

NOLAN. (For names see Territorial Alphabetical List.) A p o and mining town on the Koyukuk River, 85 m ne of Bettles and 270 nw of Fairbanks, the nearest banking point.

NOME. The metropolis of Seward Peninsula and Northwestern Alaska. Located at the mouth of Snake River on Bering Sea. It first came to the attention of the public generally in the summer of 1898, and during the next two years many thousands of people sought their fortunes there. It was not, however, until the fall of 1900 that a normal basis was reached and a well regulated government of affairs established. Nome is geographically so situated as to control the entire trade of Northeastern Siberia, Seward Peninsula and Northwestern Alaska, and is yearly increasing its trade relations with the lower Yukon Valley.

In the early rush days most of the mining was done on the beach and along the famous Anvil Creek, located about five miles distant. Since then the miner and prospector have extended their activities in all directions and have penetrated miles into the interior. At the present time mining is going on, in greater or less degree, in every part of the territory. Although mined for years beyond the usual life of placer countries, the enormous extent of gold bearing territory is far from being developed and new discoveries are constantly being made. The earlier and more primitive forms of mining have been largely supplanted by later forms and the hydraulic lift and mammoth gold dredge have taken the place of the sluice box and rocker. At the present time the country adjacent to Nome is largely given over to dredging, thousands of acres of low grade alluvial deposits practically insuring the permanency of this industry and also that of the city.

Gold is not by any means the only resource of the section of which Nome is the commercial center. The tin mines of York and Tin City are shipping through this port, from what is conceded to be one of the largest tin deposits in the world, an annually increasing tonnage of tin ore. There are also sheelite, antimony, lead, copper, silver and coal mines producing and shipping ore, which, with improved transportation facilities, should become large producers.

The fishing industry within the last few years has shown a remarkable growth, and with the building of the harbor, which is now assured, will become a business of unlimited possibilities, as the herring alone is conceded to be superior to the best Norway fish, while the cod and salmon caught in these northern waters are of supreme quality.

The vast tundras of Seward Peninsula, which are dotted with rapidly increasing herds of reindeer, promise to become an important factor in solving the meat problem of the country; shipments of the meat are now regularly made from Nome and the industry gives promise of remarkable development.

Nome has a winter population of 1000, which is increased during the summer. It has a municipal organization and a good fire department; a waterworks system operating during the open season; the townsite is patented and the streets are planked and graded. The curriculum is comparable with the best in the schools of other sections of the United States and graduates are accredited to many of the large universities. Nome is the judicial seat of the Second Division of Alaska and is also the head-

quarters of the postal service for Northern Alaska; has a government life-saving station, a customs house, a United States land office, and is the terminus of the government telegraph service, which includes wires, wireless and cable in completing telegraphic communication with the United States; has an electric light plant and a telephone system, both local and long distance, and is in communication with all parts of the district. There are three churches, Catholic, Congregationalist and Federated; a Masonic lodge, Arctic Brotherhood, Eagles, Odd Fellows and Moose lodges. All of the organizations maintain finely furnished club rooms. Two daily and one weekly newspaper, two banks with deposits of nearly two million dollars, and an excellent hospital conducted by the Sisters of Charity; it has accommodations for fifty patients and is well equipped with the essentials of surgery, including an X-ray machine. There are three prominent hotels. Nearly one hundred business houses, representing all lines, cater to the needs of the community and carry large and complete stocks. The professions are also well represented. During the open season the mails arrive by every steamer; in winter by dog teams over 1800 miles of snow and ice. The winter service is weekly and letters arrive from the States inside of six weeks.
